Launching from B&W Resort – May 24th, 2014 **Delta Sail to Spindrift Marina**

We will be launching at B&W Harbor at 9 AM for an overnight. We'll sail to the Spindrift Marina on the Stockton channel. The harbormaster at Spindrift, Dave Burns, is a sailor and said we are welcome to stay there. Overnight docking will be only \$10.00 per boat. The guest dock can hold our entire fleet. They also have clean restrooms with showers. The best part is just across the street where there is a GREAT bar and restaurant with a general store under it.

This is Memorial Day weekend so you can stay longer if you wish. You will need to let B&W know how long you will be gone.

To get to B&W Marina from the East Bay get on Highway 4 toward Antioch. Then get onto Highway 160 towards Rio Vista. Go over the Antioch Bridge and get Ripped Off for \$15.00. When you get to Highway 12, turn right and go for about 5 miles. And just before you cross a bridge turn left on Brannan Island road. This will take you right to the ramp. Launching and overnight parking at B&W will be around \$20.00

Please try to be on time so we can all go under the bridge at the same time.

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 May 3 (Sat-Sun) Moss Landing/Elkhorn Yacht Club Sail & Overnight (Mike/Bud) intermediate to advanced, depending on the weather – NOTE: most open ocean sails are advanced and not for beginners, but this year we are planning to hang out at the Elkhorn Slough Yacht Club, so it should be easy; overnighting in boats moored at the docks
May 24 (Sat-Sun) Delta Overnight Sail from B & W Resort (Jerry B) easy but sometimes intermediate when it is very windy; the overnights are on the boats moored at the docks
June 7 (Sat-Sun) Woodward Reservoir Campout* (Rich) easy to somewhat intermediate if windy; overnight in boats moored on the beach, or bring a sleeping bag & tent and camp on the beach
June 21 (Sat) Lake Hennessey* (Don/Carl) easy day sail
